

Site Visit Public Notice Guidelines

Feedback from your organization's staff, clients, patients, families, and the public with whom your organization interacts is a significant part of your evaluation.

Specifications for Public Notice Signs:

Post notices in public areas so visitors and staff of the organization are aware of the visit.

- Postings should be placed in clear, unobstructed and conspicuous public locations, such as main entrances, waiting areas, elevators and all patient care areas included in the Magnet application.
- 2. The wording, layout, and ANCC logo must be identical to that provided in the TEMPLATE. *<u>You may NOT include your organization's logo on the template</u>.
- 3. Signs must be posted by April 2, 2025 and remain posted until after the site visit.
- 4. Once public notices are posted, E-mail Beckie Mathews, <u>Beckie.mathews@ana.org</u> a copy and/or photograph of the posted notices. Details of where, how, and when the notices were posted should be included in the email.

Specifications for Public Notice Announcements:

The Public Notice announcements must be disseminated outside of your organization.

- 1. Recommended formats include but are not limited to: Public Service Announcement on the radio, banner outside of the hospital, announcement in hospital community, newsletter, newspaper ad, announcement placed on organization's website, social media, and/or billboard. More than one announcement method is recommended.
- 2. The external announcements must be actively disseminated by April 2, 2025.
- 3. The wording and format used in the announcements <u>must</u> be identical to that provided in the Public Notice TEMPLATE.

*Failure to post the required notices, as per the guidelines, may result in the rescheduling of the site visit.
